



# CONFLICT MINERALS POLICY STATEMENT

“Conflict Minerals” are minerals mined in conditions of armed conflict and human rights abuses.

In 2010, the U.S. Dobb-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (Section 1502) was passed concerning Conflict Minerals originating from the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) or adjoining countries. In 2012 the Security Exchange Commission (SEC) published final rules associated with the disclosure of the source of Conflict Minerals (known as 3TG – Tantalum, Tin, Tungsten and Gold) by US public traded companies which guides suppliers to establish policies, due diligence frameworks and management systems.

S E C Plating Pty Ltd is committed to managing our obligations in relation to Conflict Minerals as part of our corporate responsibility.

We are working toward ensuring that we do not have Conflict Minerals sourced from Conflict Mines in our products and therefore we are committed to not purchasing product and materials containing 3TG from sources that are supporting or funding conflict in this region. We ask our suppliers to take the necessary steps to demonstrate that any Conflict Minerals contained in the products supplied to S E C Plating do not originate from mines that support or fund conflict within the Democratic Republic of Congo and adjoining countries.
